Community-Building

New Family Fellowship

Contact families new to the school to answer questions, encourage them to participate in school events and make the transition easier for the family and student.

Grandparents Day (Friday, May 2, 2008)

This is a wonderful opportunity for grandparents and other adults special to our children to visit the classrooms, view art work and learn more about the clean up afterwards.

All School Picnic (Wednesday, June 18, 2008)

This event takes place the last week of school during the lunch hour. Families come together to have lunch with the students and to enjoy the fellowship of our community.

Field Day (Thursday, June 18, 2008)

Field Day is a great day of fun which takes place the last week of school and it requires a large team of parent helpers to make it a success. There are many stations of games for the kids to play. The stations are spread all over the campus and each station is manned by one teacher and one parent volunteer. The event lasts from 1:00 – 2:30pm with help needed to set up beforehand and clean up afterward as well. The chairperson will work closely with our P.E. teacher to organize the games and volunteers.

Fundraising

Jogathon (Friday, September 29, 2007)

This fundraising event gets the students involved in raising funds that are used to improve or enhance the Three Points Campus. The students collect pledges for laps they will walk or run in a 50 - 60 minute period. Parents are make this event happen by volunteering in different aspects of the events such as decorations, field setup, water station and lap station.

Harvest Festival (a.k.a. Carnival) (Friday, October 26, 2007)

All school community building event. Preschool and elementary families have the opportunity to enjoy an evening at the Main Campus playing carnival games and other activities.

Wednesday Morning Latte Cart Volunteers

Every Wednesday morning we prepare and serve lattes to teachers and staff. Two team of 3-4 people alternate weeks. This is a wonderful way to honor our teachers and staff on an ongoing basis. Time commitment is approximately from 8:30-10:00 am every other week. No experience is necessary, training and supplies will be provided.

BCS Gala and Auction (Friday, March 14, 2008)

Class or grade level student auction projects are created with the help of parent volunteers. The projects are sold at the auction.

School Support

Back to School Night (Monday, September 17, 2007)

Set up refreshments and volunteer sign-up sheets for Back to School Night and clean up afterwards.

School Photos (Individuals Oct. 9th, Retakes Nov. 7th, Class Photos Feb. 20th)

This event involves one morning in October to assist the photographers in getting classes to the MPR for their pictures, collecting money and helping with any last minute grooming, if needed. November retakes only take an hour or two. Class photos in February needs 3 volunteers and typically takes less than two hours in the morning. The chairperson is responsible for contacting/recruiting volunteers for each of the sessions.

Vision & Hearing Screening (Wednesday, October 10, 2007)

The chairperson assists with the screening of the students' vision and hearing. This event occurs in early October.

B.E.A.R. Week (Be Excited About Reading) (October 15-19, 2007)

Parents work with the Teacher's special events committee members to organize events for the week. This typically involves decorating the MPR for the Special Guest and the Teddy Bear picnic. Set up and clean up time involved.

Book Fair (Fall – Nov. 13-15, 2007 & Spring – April 29 - May 1, 2008)

The Book Fair takes place in the library during the week before Thanksgiving break and again during the week of Imagination Celebration and Grandparent's Day in the spring. Parent helpers are needed to prepare and set up the library for the book fair, to be cashiers during the book fair and to help take it down at the end. Chairperson will work closely with our Librarian, Pam Peterson.

Staff Appreciation Week (March 25-28, 2008)

Staff Appreciation is a 4-day event during which the teachers and staff are showered with love and appreciation from parents and students. Activities include bringing flowers, morning lattes and muffins and a hosted luncheon in the MPR. This is a wonderful way for parents and students to let BCS staff know how much we appreciate them. It is a big event and many volunteers are needed to run smoothly.

Track Meet (Friday, May 23, 2008)

The Track Meet Chairperson will work with the P.E. Teacher, Alicia Adams, to plan and put on the all Day track meet for the 4th, 5th and 6th grader from Three Points and Mack campuses. This is a great day and one that requires many volunteers.

Classroom

Spotlight on Speech (March 31 - April 2, 2008)

The Chairperson will work closely with Mrs. Valentine, the Enrichment specialist. This person will be responsible for coordinating/recruiting volunteers to help judge the speeches.

Imagination Celebration (Thursday, May 1, 2008 6:30-8:30pm)

The Imagination Celebration Chairperson will work with the Art teacher in putting on this annual event which usually takes place on the first Thursday evening of each May. The volunteer commitment generally involves assisting the Art teacher in putting up and taking down the art displays for the celebration. One or two day commitment.

Student Activities

Band Parent (5th and 6th Grade)

Work with Mr. Ekpo, the 5th and 6th grade band teacher, to help with concerts as needed. Usually this will involve helping to set up for concerts and arranging for a light snack and refreshment to be served and perhaps facilitating the printing of the programs.

Library Helpers

Assist the librarian, Pam Peterson, in the library on a weekly basis.

Music Volunteers

Assist music teacher with special events and recruit volunteers when needed. Piano accompanists are also needed.

Popcorn Friday

Sixth grade parents coordinate the operation of the popcorn machine on Fridays. Popcorn is for sale for \$0.25 to the students during recess. The proceeds are donated to a charitable cause.

Parent Activities

Building and Grounds

Volunteers work with PTF and the principal on school grounds beautification projects during the year. Projects are designed to encourage student and parent participation.

Bulletin Board

Responsible for decorating the bulletin boards in the breezeway between the library and MPR with school photos, etc. with changing themes throughout the school year. A grade level is highlighted each month. Grade level representatives will collect photographs for their grade, design the bulletin board and set up the display.

In-Service Luncheons for Teachers

Provide buffet style lunch in the teacher's lounge for the teachers and staff at three in-service days throughout the school year.

Moms in Touch

Intercede for our children and school staff through prayer and pray that Biblical values and high moral standards may guide our school. Parents meet on Monday mornings on campus at 8:30 am and Thursdays off campus at 8:30 am.

Room Parents

Help your teacher, along with classroom volunteers, with class parties and other special class projects as needed.

Thursday Packets

Every Thursday morning during the school year, 4-5 volunteers meet to compile Thursday packets (all the school information flyers to be sent home) and distribute them to the classrooms. The time commitment is 1-2 hours weekly.

Yearbook

Chairperson will coordinate the collection of digital photos at school events throughout the year with at least one parent photographer volunteer from each grade level. Chairperson will supervise the printing, order taking and distribution. A calendar of when/what to do is already established.

Yearbook Classroom Photographers

Volunteers are needed from each classroom to take photos of that class during special events throughout the year and turn them in (labeled with children's names) to the yearbook chairperson in the spring.
