



Art:

Sixth graders evaluated works of art using supportive evidence and criteria. They learned to use different shades of colors as well as varieties of types and qualities of painting techniques to create light, middle, and dark values. They practiced creating the illusion of 3-D forms in a two-dimensional work of art using the principal of design and balance incorporating layering technique with acrylic paint.

Computer & TxStudio:

This trimester sixth graders were challenged to choose a scene from the Easter story and animate it at Stykz.net. For Mother's Day, they designed radial flower cards using [Silhouette Studio](#) software. In Word, students learned how to create and edit a cover page and a table of contents page. Students continued to work in their code.org course, demonstrating perseverance solving the puzzles and creating their own projects. We learned that computers process, transmit, and store data using the binary system. Then students solved puzzles by converting base 10 number to binary numbers. Sixth graders designed PowerPoint slides with their 6-Word Memoirs for the moving up ceremony. In the area of digital citizenship, we discussed copyright infringement and Creative Commons, how to avoid digital drama, and how to respond to cyberbullying. Sixth graders continued to work on their touch-typing skills to improve speed and accuracy. They are encouraged to use their [Edotyping](#) account this summer before it expires at the end of August.
